General Regulations for Horses and Pony Show

Judging:

- 1 State 4-Horse rules will apply
- 2 All animals in a CLASS will be judged together.
- 3 An animal in a Class will NOT be able to win more than ONE PLACE

Superintendent:

- 1 Will determine Junior and senior divisions ages,
- 2 May call upon current membership,
- 3 All classes will be held together and conducted on time.

Exhibitor:

- 1 4-H Horse & Ponies must be enrolled in a 4-H horse club and must meet the Equine Health requirements.
- 2 The FFA Horse & Ponies must be their supervised agricultural production project and must meet the Equine Health Requirements.
- 3 Open Class Horse & Ponies must meet the Equine Health Requirments.
- 4 Must show the same horse through all classes.

- 3 Please print your club name
- 4 Please print your school name.
- 5 Please print your age.
- 6 Youth 19 and Under must use the Department number 11.

- 7 If you do not fit a. or b. above use Department number 01

General Regulations for Horses Shown at Halter

Judging:

- 1 State 4-Horse rules will apply
- 2 All animals in a CLASS will be judged together.
- 3 An animal in a Class will NOT be able to win more than ONE PLACE
- 4 If the number of entries does not warrant all of the below classes, several may be combined; e.g. 3-year-olds and 2-year-olds may be combined, and yearlings and 2-year-olds may be combined.
- 5 Premiums will be reimbursable when paid for Horse or Pony shows as long as these events are competitive and open to all participants.
- 6 If the fair is holding a Quarter Horse Show approved by A.Q.H.A., then the rules and classes described in the Official Handbook of A.Q.H.A. shall prevail.

Heavy Draft, Registered

General Regulations for Draft Horses

Judging:

- 1 All animals must compete and be shown.
- 2 No horse or team of horses shall be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
- 3 In no case is it permissible to show mixed breeds in the same class or division to be judged against each other for premiums.
- 4 Open classes (19 and over) must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging.

Superintendent:

- 1 The Fair reserves the right to refuse any or all entries.
- 2 A purebred registration certificate must be supplied to the Division Superintendent at his request

Exhibitor:

- 1 One person or firm must own horses entered as matched pairs.
- 2 No grade stallions shall be accepted for entry.
- 3 Open Class Horse & Ponies must meet the Equine Health Requirements.
- 4 Must show the same horse through all classes.
- 5 Animals or combinations of animals owned by one exhibitor may be entered in the classes following.

Horses–Good Housekeeping Awards {Each exhibitor}**General Rules for Horses–Good Housekeeping Awards**

- 2 Horse exhibitors who maintain the most attractive and sanitary exhibits will be eligible for special premiums.
- 3 All horse exhibits will be scored on the following basis:

- Cleanliness of animals
15 points
- Cleanliness of bedding
15 points
- Entry card and ribbons properly displayed with animal
20 points
- Keeping grain and hay feed presentable
10 points
- Keeping all equipment sanitary and neat
10 points
- Keeping aisles clean
15 points
- Courtesy to people
15 points
- Total 100 points
- Inspections to be made unannounced.
- Prizes will be awarded on a weekly basis.
